

2026-2027 Theme: SOLI DEO GLORIA “...do ALL to the glory of GOD” 1 Corinthians 10:31b

Soli Deo Gloria, one of the five *solas* of the Reformation, is a Latin phrase meaning “**To God alone be the glory.**” This phrase affirms the Scriptural truth that God is sovereign over all creation and over redemption. Every area of activity at school must ultimately bring honor to God. We must recognize that the time, talents, resources, opportunities, and successes we are given to manage, are gifts from God; therefore, the faithful use of them must reflect His character and purposes in the world.

In a Christian educational setting, *Soli Deo Gloria* sets visionary direction and provides purpose-driven motivation. It reminds students and staff that knowledge is not the end of learning. What we come to know must be used to love God more fully and to serve others more effectively. Whether studying literature, science, mathematics, the arts, humanities, trades, or history, we seek to live *Coram Deo* - before the face of God - understanding that all truth is God’s truth and that faithful scholarship is an act of worship.

Throughout our Christian school community, *Soli Deo Gloria* must shape not only what we believe, but also how we live. By God’s grace, our lives must demonstrate the pursuit of excellence with humility, the practice of integrity, the expression of gratitude, and service to others, in love. Living *Soli Deo Gloria* calls us to resist pride and self-promotion. Instead, our lives - thoughts, words, and actions - ought to point others to Christ. Whether in the classroom, at home, on the playground, at work, in society, or in the church, all our relationships and activities must be done in total dependence on our God, while striving to “do all to the glory of God.” (1 Corinthians 10:31b)
